Sign up for the summer reading program at the library!	Find an empty cardboard box and pretend that it's something else!	Visit a library storytime program and sing a song with the other kids!	Write the first letter of your name. Trace it with your finger and practice the sound it makes.	Cook a meal together. Talk through each step with your child.
Read an alphabet book and practice making the sounds for each letter.	Make an indoor fort with blankets and furniture.	Dance around the house while singing a silly song.	Visit the library and draw a picture on the table in the children's section!	Take a walk and talk about the things you see.
Visit the library and ask the librarian for a good book to read together.	Blow bubbles and count how many you can see at one time!	Sing the ABC song and clap with each letter.	Make play dough into letters of your name. Using play dough builds writing muscles!	Look at a photo or photo album and talk about who's in the picture and what they're doing.
Read a book together and ask questions about what will happen next.	Play peek-a-boo or hide-and-seek.	Check out a children's music CD from the library and learn a new song!	Let your child help you "write" your grocery list.	Make getting dressed into a game. Decide what comes first—pants or undies?
Read a silly book.	Visit the library and play with something fun in the children's area!	Sing "Baa, Baa Black Sheep" - and then sing it with red, blue, yellow, and green sheep!	Make the first letter of your name into an imaginary creature!	How many words can you think of that rhyme with "cat" or "fox"?
Read a story and count something in the story.	Visit the zoo (or pretend to!). What animals do you see and what sounds do they make?	Find things around the house to use as instruments (pots and pans work great!), and sing and play a song together.	Draw a rainbow together and name the colors.	Visit the library and tell a librarian something fun you did this week!
